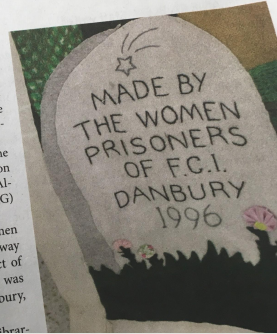
## SU quilting its way into LGBT History Month
